Emergency Procedures 658E.c.2.1	Provider is trained and has developed a procedure for responding to situations when an immediate emergency medical response is required. <i>CFOC-3.4.3.1</i>	
	Providers must have a plan in place that makes sense for their facility and for the needs of children in their care and identifies accommodations for children with disabilities, and children with chronic medical conditions. Also, their plan must include a plan for in place evacuation, relocation, shelter-in-place, lockdown, and communications with and reunification of families.

Program reports to the child abuse reporting hotline, the Department of Social Services, child protective services, or the police as required by state and local laws, in any instance where there is reasonable cause to believe that child abuse and neglect has occurred. Sun Safety Including Sunscreen	Provider ensures sun safety for themselves and children under their supervision. <i>CFOC-3.4.5.1</i>
